

INTRODUCTION TO DRAWING

Learn how to see details and create accurate drawings. Engaging subjects such as portraiture, landscapes and still life will develop the students understanding of different styles, mediums and techniques that will create a unified work of art.

SUMMER TRAVEL JOURNEY

Learn quick and handy drawing, painting, and rendering techniques in pencil, pen and Ink, conte, collage, watercolour and acrylic paint, that are ideal for capturing your favourite travel images, scenes and memories to create a beautiful travel diary. Build your own clever compositions incorporating mixed media items such as travel tickets, magazine images, and newspaper clippings and other curiosities into your drawings, paintings, and mixed media projects. 


Instructor: **Mike Goodge**



THE GRAND TOUR – EUROPE! 8-12 yrs pm

Calling all young ladies and lads to join us on this timeless, traditional and classic tour of Europe! Athens, Florence, Amsterdam, and Vienna are the destinations on your art-making itinerary. The journey begins in Greece as you explore the ancient orders of classical architecture and sculpture – Doric, Ionic and Corinthian. Then onto Italy for magnificent Renaissance master drawings. Venture north to the Netherlands and discover the sensuous richness and drama of Baroque portraits. Finally, this grand tour rounds out in Austria with the detailed and decorative arts of the Jugendstil. Projects include plaster and plasticine sculpture and classical reliefs; sanguine, sepia and black conte master drawings; lusciously painted impasto portraits; imaginative, fantastical art nouveau forests and landscapes with mixed media gold and jewel patterned colours.

EXTREME ART! 7-11 yrs pm

INSTRUCTOR: **Mike Goodge**

Design surf boards, parasails, skateboards, and the fastest of race cars with your own graphic art. MORNING

MUMMY MADNESS – EXPLORING EGYPT! 4-6 yrs am

INSTRUCTOR: **Mike Goodge**

What is thousands of years old, all wrapped up and buried deep below a Pyramid? A mummy! Make a fabulous Pharaoh's tomb and pyramid. Draw a map to an ancient city and create a decorative papyrus scroll. Design your own name in hieroglyphs and craft bejewelled accoutrements to wear and use. Students will draw, paint, sculpt, design, and make prints and reliefs.

TRANSFORMERS, CYBORGS AND THE ART OF FANTASTIC

MACHINERY 7-11 yrs am

INSTRUCTOR: **Olga Lysenko**

Many significant and successful artists have used machinery for inspiration and as a starting point for investigation. In this course we'll look at extraordinary examples of futuristic vision and engineering genius. We will create mechanical illustrations and diagrams based on French artist Francis Picabia. Students will explore graphic works

by Scottish artist Eduardo Paolozzi, and will paint their own compositions inspired by mechanics and technology. We will use traditional and recycled materials to sculpt dynamic futuristic creatures in the style of Jacob Epstein and Umberto Boccioni. We are NOT the robots!

THE WORLD OF ART NOUVEAU 8-12 yrs am

INSTRUCTOR: **Shoora Majedian**

This international style embraced everything from architecture to art and design. Decorative features inspired by natural forms and structures, curved lines and gilded colourful patterning identify the age of Art Nouveau. Make elaborately detailed objects d'art and design, both in 2D and 3D, inspired by the artists, designers, architects, and noted practitioners of the era. Projects will reference works by Gustav Klimt, Aubrey Beardsley, Antoni Gaudi, and Louis Comfort Tiffany. This camp includes a wide variety of drawing, painting, illustration, mixed media and sculpture projects.

AFTERNOON

MADE IN CANADA 4-6 yrs pm

INSTRUCTOR: **Mike Goodge**

This course introduces students to themes and styles in traditional and contemporary Canadian art. This is a great opportunity to learn new techniques in drawing, painting and sculpture, while getting to know our unique national heritage. Projects reference totemic sculpture and images from the West Coast and Emily Carr, Group of Seven landscapes, as well as abstract and figurative works by artists such as Harold Town and Norval Morrisseau.

DESIGN U! 6-9 yrs pm


INSTRUCTOR: **Shoora Majedian**

Explore industrial and graphic design through a series of fun and innovative projects such as building a scale model of a structure complete with landscape, creating a musical instrument and designing a brand logo and poster. MODERN MASTERS 8-12 yrs pm

INSTRUCTOR: **Olga Lysenko**

Discover the world of our modern masters while thinking outside the box. This camp encourages individuality and experimentation with both classical and contemporary techniques. Students are encouraged to develop original thinking and challenging concepts while exploring the possibilities of their mediums and materials. Painting projects reference the work of several artists including Jean Michel Basquiat and Patterson Ewen; sculpture projects are based on the works of Shary Boyle and Jeff Koons; Rauschenberg and Warhol inspire printmaking and collage; assemblage and mixed media constructions are based on the work of Joyce Wieland and Louise Nevelson.





MORNING

FOR THE LOVE OF GODS! 4-6 yrs am

INSTRUCTOR: **Yusra Mukhtar**

Learn about the use and significance of myths and religions to tell stories in narrative and symbolic art. Paint detailed Byzantine icons with gold paint and brilliant jewel colours, create illuminated manuscripts and journals with special papers, make a Buddha from clay, and even draw the image of God from your own personal interpretation using watercolour pencils and ink. We will also explore Greek Myths, Roman Olympians, Tibetan prayer flags, Islamic calligraphy, and the mystery of Easter Island and Stonehenge.

CAMERA! ROLLING! ACTION! 7-11 yrs am

Draw, paint, print, collage and sculpt your way through Carr's haunting west coast forests, O'Keeffe's magnificent flowers, and Kahlo's brilliantly-coloured surreal portraits.

AFTERNOON

MEDIEVAL LEGENDS 4-6 yrs pm

INSTRUCTOR: **Yusra Mukhtar**

Step back in medieval times! Learn about tales of chivalry and bravery with Sir Lancelot, King Arthur and his Knights of the Round Table, while you create and paint a castle, draw a Gothic church elevation, design a stained glass windows, and collage a family crest and Standard flag. Learn about arms, armour and the fashion of Queen Guinevere and her court. Be inspired to create your own personal codex like the learned monks. Experience a full week of art, history, and mystery!

LEGO WORLD 7-11 yrs pm

INSTRUCTOR: **Mike Goodge**

Do you love building in Lego? Build a bipedal Bionicle, a sleek star fighter, a wizard's castle, a small dwelling or multi terrain vehicle. The intention is to build with Lego and then spend some time drawing and painting your creations with backdrops and extreme lighting to get haunting shadows and wonderful perspective! We will also try printmaking Lego and even cast low relief sculptures in plaster. Art Works will have Lego on hand for this camp. Beware: If you bring in your own Lego creations from home they may get mixed in.

LOCO FOR ROCOCO! 8-12 yrs pm

INSTRUCTOR: **Olga Lysenko**

Welcome to 18th century France, with its lavishly decorated palaces, overgrown gardens, and outrageously pompous fashions. This is Rococo – an art period famous for its ornate, elegant, luxurious and playful style. Students will pay homage to the paintings of Jean-Honore Fragonard and Francois Boucher by composing a Rococo landscape, replete with Cupids, fountains and flowers. Working with various modeling materials, students will create a delicate figurative sculpture based on porcelain statuettes of Franz Anton Bustelli. Campers will further explore the theatrical elements of Rococo by making drawings, illustrations and prints of costumes, fashions and monumental headdresses. This is a super fun and mischievously creative course.

WEEK 6: August 8-11 (4 days)



MORNING

ALL ABOUT DRAWING AND PAINTING 4-6 yrs am

INSTRUCTOR: **Mike Goodge**

Formal but fun studio exercises introduce students to techniques in drawing, painting, sculpture and printmaking. By exploring the work of traditional and modern masters, both time-honoured and experimental techniques in pencil, charcoal, conte, pastel, pen and ink, acrylic paint and printmaking will be taught through several step-by-step projects. Subjects include portraits and the figure, landscapes and streetscapes, still-life objects, plants and flowers, nature, animals and critters.

EXPLORATIONS IN 2D - DRAWING AND PAINTING 7-12 yrs am

INSTRUCTOR: **Olga Lysenko**

Working from a variety of subjects, students will develop their studio skills with an emphasis on traditional approaches to drawing and painting. Fundamentals in drawing will include gesture, contour, composition, tonal values, and perspective. Through painting, students will learn colour mixing, application and descriptive use of colour. Projects include works on paper, canvas, newspaper and mixed media, with technique building in pencil, pen and ink, charcoal, conte, pastels, prints, watercolour and acrylic paints. This camp will inspire young artists and give them the tools needed to enhance their learning in art. Subjects include portraits and the figure, landscapes and streetscapes, architecture, still-life objects, plants, fruit, flowers, nature, animals and critters. Artists referenced are Cathy Daley, David Milne, Donald Sultan, Eric Freifeld, Paraskeva Clark and Susan Rothenberg.

AFTERNOON

ALL ABOUT SCULPTURE AND MIXED MEDIA 4-6 yrs pm

INSTRUCTOR: **Mike Goodge**

This camp includes fun projects with some skill-building techniques for the budding young artist! They learn to form in three-dimensional space and explore some dynamic approaches to working with new materials. Students will discover how to use clay, wire, fabric, masking tape, plaster and paint to construct a figurative sculpture, design a freeform abstract sculpture and create a scale model of a person or a pet. Mixed media projects on paper and printmaking will be included. Subjects explored are portraits and the figure, landscapes and streetscapes, still-life objects, plants and flowers, nature, animals and critters.

EXPLORATIONS IN 3D – SCULPTURE AND MORE 7-12 yrs **pm**

INSTRUCTOR: **Olga Lysenko**

In this skill-building course students will learn to represent forms in two and three-dimensional space. Explore structure, dimension and proportion of various objects and figure based work in a series of studies. Then, discover how you can use clay, wood, wire, fabric, masking tape, plaster and paint to construct your sculptures, and design models to scale. Students will be encouraged to experiment and give their pieces unique characteristics. Subjects include portraits and the figure, landscapes and streetscapes, architecture, still-life objects, plants, fruit, flowers and topiaries, nature, animals and critters. Look for inspiration to the iconic artworks of Alexander Calder, Constantin Brancusi, Jeff Koons, Kathe Kollwitz, Louise Bourgeois, Marisol Escobar, and Pablo Picasso.



REGISTRATION INFORMATION

Please read the following if you are registering for a class or camp:

Procedure: Registration can be made by mail, in person at the school; by telephone, or on-line. **YOUR REGISTRATION IS VALID ONCE FULL PAYMENT IS MADE AND PROCESSED.** We issue receipts via email. Payment can be made either by cash, cheque, debit, VISA, Master Card or American Express. Registrations are on a first-come first-served basis as soon as term schedules are available. *We do not prorate camps.* Adult classes are limited by the size of studio. Teens and children's classes are limited to 18 students per class, with the exception of Kinder Kids which is limited to 12 and Free to Be Three which is limited to 6. Your payment of the registered art class will assure you of your place in the class. Classes may be postponed due to enrolment numbers, please call the school to confirm start date. We do not call students if a class is running, only in the event of postponing or cancelling a class.

Discounts: A 10% discount fee is given for the second child or teen's course in the same family by a sibling or by the same child if registered in the same term. **This discount is not applicable to adult classes, birthdays or to camps.** Seniors (65 years or older) receive a 10% discount for classes they take, upon presentation of identification.

Class Cancellations: Students may cancel their registration without charge up to 14 calendar days prior to course start date with the exception of a 6% cancellation fee for credit card refunds which will immediately apply.
